Our Year 8 Careers curriculum continues, encouraging reflection on individual strengths, future ambitions, and the concept of vocation. The Careers curriculum in Year 8 allows students to reflect on their strengths, interests, and aspirations as they begin to consider their future pathways. By this stage, students are familiar with the school environment, and it's a good time to introduce them to the concept of careers and the skills needed for different professions. This timing helps students connect their academic work to future opportunities and start thinking about their GCSE choices. Early exposure to career possibilities encourages informed decision-making, goal setting, and an understanding of the relevance of their current education to future success. Year 8 also have the opportunity to attend the annual Careers Convention in the autumn term.
